Item No. 23.2: To place before the Academic Council the Report about the Action Taken on the decision of its 22nd Meeting of the Academic Council held on 18th January, 2019.

The Academic Council noted the Action Taken on the decisions of 22nd Meeting of the Academic Council dated 18th January, 2019.

ITEM(S) FOR RATIFICATION

Item No. 23.3: To ratify the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor under sub-section (3) of Section 11 of the Central Universities Act 2009 with regard to approval of University Prospectus 2019-20 for admission to Certificate/ Under-Graduate/ Post-Graduate Programmes.

In order to start the process of admissions to the approved Certificate/ Under-Graduate/ Post-Graduate Programmes, the prospectus of the University was drafted out by the Committee consisting of all Deans of different Schools and Deans Students' Welfare, under the direction and supervision of the Vice-Chancellor. A copy of the University Prospectus 2019-20 is placed before the Academic Council at ANNEXURE-23.3A.

As per Statute 14(d), the power to frame such regulations and rules consistent with the Statutes and Ordinances regarding the academic functioning of the University, discipline, residence, admission, award of fellowship and studentships, fees, concessions, corporate life and attendance is vested with the Academic Council of the University. As such, the Prospectus of the University for the Academic Year 2019-20 for admission to Certificate/Under-Graduate/Post-Graduate Programmes was required to be considered and approved by the Academic Council.

Since the process of making admissions could not be started till the prospectus is approved by the competent authority i.e. Academic Council and it was not possible to convene the meeting of the Academic Council, in view of the fact that the admission process is an important and time bound activity, the Prospectus 2019-20 of the University was approved by the Vice-Chancellor, exercising of the power vested in him vide sub-section (3) of Section 11 of the Central Universities Act 2009, in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council.

The Academic Council noted and ratified the decision taken by the Vice-Chancellor.

Item No. 23.4: To place before the Academic Council the matter regarding approval of application format for direct recruitment of Teaching positions as per UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and Other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2018.

Consequent upon notification of UGC Regulations, 2018 by the University Grants Commission and adoption of the same by this University it is felt necessary to incorporate the provisions of UGC Regulations, 2018 in the application format for direct recruitment of teachers. Accordingly, the Vice-Chancellor constituted a committee under the chairmanship of Pro-vice-Chancellor. The said committee after deliberations on the issue suggested a draft format of application for direct recruitment of teachers which was approved by the Vice-Chancellor. The said draft format suggested by the committee and further approved by the Vice-Chancellor is placed at **ANNEXURE-23.4A**.

The Academic Council noted and ratified the decision taken by the Vice-Chancellor. The Council also approved that the screening/short-listing of candidates for various teaching positions should be done strictly as per provisions contained in UGC Regulations, 2018. The Council further approved that the provisions of the UGC Regulations, 2018 shall be implemented in the University *mutatis-mutandis*.

Item No. 23.5

To place before the Academic Council the matter regarding nomination of 20 students to the Students' Council on the basis of merit of studies, sports and extra-curricular activities as per Ordinance No. 45: CUHP Rules for the Formation of Students' Council.

Clause 16(a) of Ordinance 45 "CUHP Rules for the Formation of the Students' Council" provides that twenty students shall be nominated to the Students' Council by the Academic council on the basis of merit of Studies, sports, extra-curricular activities.

The Vice-Chancellor under Power vested in him vide Act 11(3) of the Central Universities Act, 2009 approved the nomination of twenty students in the Student Council on the basis of merit of Studies, sports, extra-curricular activities. The list is attached as ANNEXURE- 23.5A.

The Academic Council noted and ratified the same.

ITEM(S) FOR CONSIDERATION AND DECISION

Item No. 23.6

To place before the Academic Council the amended in Ordinance 47 : Promotion of University Teachers under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) as per UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2018.

The Ordinance 47 of the University contains provision for promotion of University teachers under Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) which was framed in accordance with the UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and

Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2010. Consequent upon notification of UGC Regulations on Minimum Qualifications for Appointment of Teachers and other Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education, 2018 the necessary amendments are required to be done in order to incorporate the provisions as contained under UGC Regulations, 2018. For the very purpose the Vice-Chancellor constituted a committee under the chairmanship of Pro-Vice-Chancellor. The Committee suggested the modified draft of Ordinance 47 which is placed as **ANNEXURE-23.6A**.

The Academic Council after considering the proposed amendments in Ordinance 47, approved and further recommended the same to the Executive Council for its approval.

Item No. 23.7 To place before the Academic Council the amendment in Ordinance 30: Medium of Instruction, Examination, Evaluation and Grading System for Programmes of Studies other than the Research Degree Programme

The Ordinance 30 of the University contains provisions for Medium of Instruction, Examination, Evaluation and Grading System for Programmes of Studies other than the Research Degree Programme. In order to academic streamlining the Vice-Chancellor constituted a Committee under Chairmanship of Pro Vice-Chancellor to look into the Ordinances related to academics. The Academic Council in its 21st Meeting held on 29.10.2018 vide item No. 21.9 has referred back the amendment to the Committee for reconsideration in the light of discussions. Accordingly, the Committee suggested the following draft of amendments to be incorporated in the Ordinance 30 of the University:

The Council further authorized the Vice-Chancellor to constitute a Committee to look into and examine the difficulties faced by the University in examinations, evaluation and grading system for programmes of studies other than research degree programme in the University.

Item No. 23.8

To place before the Academic Council the matter regarding approval of following Memorandum of Understanding(s) (MoU).

(a) Treidge Solutions Pvt. Ltd.

Triedge Solutions Pvt. Ltd., West Nagar, New Delhi vide email dated 22nd January, 2019 has forwarded the proposal to entered into MoU with the University to access to career services and opportunities to those students of the Institution who register on its website www.triedge.in ("Registered Students") and agree to abide with the Terms and Conditions. Triedge will host internship and placement opportunities posted by its Clients across functions and sectors including HR, Sales & Marketing, Finance, Analytics, Operations, Digital Marketing, Telecom, Electronics, Construction, Healthcare, Sports, Fitness and Leisure, IT-ITES, Retail, Apparel, Logistic, Media, BFSI, Handicrafts, Beauty and Wellness, Tourism and Hospitality etc.

(b) Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, Delhi (DAIC)

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Department of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi vide letter Ref. No. AP/DAIC/FEBRUARY/2019/115 dated 20th Feb, 2019 forwarded a proposal of MoU to promote and support high-quality research on social and economic issues, develop a national data base through various studies conducted from time to time, disseminate knowledge aggregated through the research work and nurture social scientists to meet the needs of users and beneficiaries.

(c) Research for Resurgence Foundation, Nagpur

The Research for Resurgence Foundation, Nagpur has forwarded a proposal for establishment of Research for Resurgence Outreach Centre in the Central University of Himachal Pradesh to bring paradigm shift in research outcome, research methodology and

innovation based technologies, ensuring Bharatiya prospective philosophy and applicability. The Foundation is interested in working together with mutual collaboration to give each other's strengths in research and facilities thereof, will mutually benefit the students and faculties for nurturing the research, innovation and creativity among students. Therefore, they are interested to enter into a MOU to establish a strong academic collaboration, by undertaking joint responsibilities and activities in their respective field of excellence, research, resources, knowledge and human.

Therefore, as per provisions contained in Ordinance No. 27 : Procedure for Co-operation and Collaboration with Other Universities, Institution and other Agencies including learned bodies or associations, the Vice-Chancellor has constituted a committee vide Notification F.No. 1-8/CUHP/Acad./2015/ 786-87 dated 31st January, 2019 to examine and deliberate on terms and conditions of the aforesaid mentioned Memorandum of Understanding(s) taking into consideration all aspects involving rights and obligations of the University.

**(d) Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA),
New Delhi**

A proposal from Member Secretary, Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), New Delhi has been received vide letter D.No. 3.7/MS/IGNCA/2017 dated 24th March, 2017. To examine the proposal, the Vice-Chancellor vide Notification No. 1-8/CUHP/Acad./2015/1235-40 dated 25.04.2017 constituted a committee in consonance with Ordinance 27 : Procedure for Co-operation and Collaboration with other Universities, Institutions and Other Agencies including Learned Bodies or Association.

The aforesaid Committee examined the proposal taking into consideration all aspects involving rights and obligations of the University and made its recommendations vide their minutes dated 21.05.2018 that it is beneficial for the student of the University.

The Academic Council after deliberations on the draft MoU(s). approved and further recommended the same to the Executive Council for its approval.

- Item No. 23.9** To place before the Academic Council the recommendations of School Board of School of Education.

Clause 15(2) of the Statute provides that every school shall have a School Board and the members of the first School Board shall be nominated by the Executive Council for a period of three years. Ordinance 22: Constitution, Powers and Functions of the School Board provides that, "The Board shall hold at least two ordinary meetings in an Academic year, one in each semester". The Minutes of the 4th School Board Meeting of School of Education held on 13.03.2019 is placed at ANNEXURE-23.9(A) for the consideration and approval of the Academic Council.

The Academic Council approved and recommended the Minutes of the 4th School Board of School of Education to the Executive Council for its approval.

- Item No. 23.1(T)** To place before the Academic Council the matter regarding appointment of Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor

The Central University of Himachal Pradesh is in its nascent stage and to start the new department or courses, the University requires the services of Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor to attain the objectives of the University by way of utilizing their services in the development of academic, research and other academic activities of the University. Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor will be expected to teach courses directly related to his specific expertise and professional experience or the areas of his specialization. He may also contribute to the institution's activities like counseling of students, developing new course(s) and pedagogical improvements. The core courses pertaining to specialized skills/trades may be offered by the Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor from industry, the trainers approved by Sector Skill Councils or other persons with appropriate skill proficiency. Such faculty, imparting education and training to learners in skill based course, should have relevant NSQF qualifications, preferably certified by the relevant Sector Skill Council. Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor may also be involved in the M.Phil/ Ph.D. Coursework based on his professional and research proficiency adjudged by the concerned institution.

Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor will be expected to facilitate the setting of workshops and labs, providing hands on training in the relevant domain areas, development of soft skills, and focus on ensuring competency based learning outcomes among students.

Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor is expected to interact with the research students in the area of his specialization or professional proficiency. But he/she will not be eligible to act as a supervisor of any Research Student. The Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor may not be expected to conduct independent research, instead, he/she may participate by advising faculty on their research projects, serving as a liaison between the institutions and industry or government entities to identify research and/or funding opportunities or by working with faculty to identify research projects that would benefit private industry and/or government entities.

Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor is also expected to actively participate in service-related activities, such as departmental committees, serving as advisor to faculty and/or undergraduate and post-graduate students, helping students' network and active collaboration with the industry/employer providing internship and job opportunities.

The Academic Council approved the provision of appointment of Academic Consultant/Academic Advisor in the University. The Academic Council further expressed its concern that minimum qualifications, mode/procedure of appointment, emoluments, terms & conditions of service of the Academic Consultant/ Academic Advisor be drafted in the form of an Ordinance and be placed before the competent authorities for its approval.

Item No. 23.2(T) To place before the Academic Council the approval of M.A. in Jammu & Kashmir Studies under Department of History, Culture and Archaeology

The Executive Council vide Item No. 35.6 dated 27th November, 2018 approved the recommendations of Academic Council vide

Item No. 21.6 in its 21st meeting held on 29th October, 2018 for two years degree course in MA in Jammu & Kashmir Studies.

The details for programme duration, minimum eligibility conditions, minimum qualifying marks, criteria for selection, credit requirements, fees and other charges, etc. is placed at **Annexure-23.2(T)A**.

The Academic Council considered the details for programme duration, minimum eligibility conditions, minimum qualifying marks, criteria for selection, credit requirements, fees and other charges, etc. for MA in Jammu & Kashmir Studies under Department of History, Culture & Archaeology and approved the same. The Academic Council further recommended the proposal to the Executive Council for its approval.
